A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

“Little children, let us love, not in work or speech, but in truth and action.” (1 John 3:18)

A few weeks ago May 13 was listed on the Christian calendar as “Ascension Day.” That is a day that comes after Easter and before Pentecost Sunday. It reminds us of Jesus “ascending” to heaven. And as we find in the closing chapter of Matthew 28, before he left, he gave clear instructions to the disciples which we now call the “Great Commission” to go and make disciples (Matthew 28:16-20). And this is our “commission” as today we are called to be a “go and see” church in combination with being a “come and see” church.

Daily reaching out to others with compassion, love, and concern, should be as natural as breathing. Giving hands and feet to God’s love is what God’s children are supposed to do. And to do so without advertising it, but as acts of humble service. There is a wonderful Jewish legend that illustrates this in a beautiful way:

There is a Jewish Talmudic tradition that teaches the “Legend of the Just” – or in Hebrew the “Lamed-Vav Tzadikim”. “Lamed” is Hebrew for 30; “Vav” is six, so these are the “36-ers, the 36 humble, righteous ones, also known as “The Concealed Ones.” The Legend of the Just states that at any time there are at least 36 righteous people on earth, those upon whom God’s radiance rests. In what sounds like a remix of God’s deal with Abraham and Sodom and Gomorrah – you remember, if Abraham could find ten righteous inhabitants the cities would be spared – these 36 “tzadikim” function as the safety on God’s trigger finger. As long as there are these 36 righteous ones upon the earth, God will stay his hand from punishing the planet for its wickedness and waywardness.

The most remarkable thing about these “righteous ones”, these “tzadikim”, is that they have no inkling that they are “tzadikim”. That’s why they’re known as “The Concealed Ones.” They are simple men and women living a simple life inscribed, proscribed, and transcribed by a love of God so great that it spreads that love everywhere, every day, every way. Proof positive that you are not one of these righteous ones is if you proclaim your righteousness.

The Legend of the Tzadikim also asserts that the Tzadikim don’t know each other, and if they do discover another Tzadikim they will die. From this tradition comes the teaching that every Jew is called to live humble, unobtrusive, dedicated, compassionate lives – to live as if they could be one of the Tzadikim, yet to live without ever professing any special righteousness for oneself.

Could you be one of the Tzadikim? Could you be one of the “Concealed Ones?” Might one of more of the Tzadikim be part of our church family? Hmmm...

MOVING ON FROM THE PANDEMIC

Before you read further, this is not to say the pandemic is over, because it is not! However, things ARE changing for the better, demonstrated by changing health requirements for masks and distancing. We continue to closely follow those changing rules as we work to keep folks safe whenever we gather in groups.

What has not changed? For fully vaccinated folks, distancing and masking are optional in many settings, including our church; those who are not yet comfortable making changes should continue to abide by their comfort zone. We've kind of gotten used to those rules. If you are not vaccinated, we encourage you to continue to mask and distance.

On an incredibly positive note, read on. There was barely a ripple in the occurrence of flu this past season, due to mask wearing, hand washing and distancing. This is an important lesson for us all to remember when that season returns yet again.

Our hand sanitizers in the church building contain Purell and the dispensers work with a little encouragement and patience. It may take 2-3 passes to get enough gel due to the consistency but be patient and it will come. Remember, hand washing with soap and water (warm is best but not essential) is always preferred over using sanitizer. Germs are banished by the use of soap, which breaks down the protective layers of germs, friction, covering all skin surfaces, and water, which washes them down the drain – all done for 20 seconds which is Happy Birthday sung 2 times. Sanitizer should be reserved for times when soap and water are not available. Sanitizers kill good as well as bad germs, which can contribute to germs that are resistant to antibiotics. Last word on this: beware – the word “germ” covers two different organisms – bacteria and viruses. Many products say, “Kills 99% of bacteria”, which means it may not kill viruses. Look for the listing of what the sanitizer kills – “human coronavirus” is what you are looking for– it doesn't have to say COVID-19.

If you have not yet been vaccinated, there are many places to receive the shot(s) including Ashtabula County Health Department, Drug Mart, Walgreens, Giant Eagle, Walmart, and CVS. Call to find out how to get an appointment – some use online, others by phone appointment or just walk in at certain times. Longer term use of the vaccines continues to yield very limited substantiated reactions. Use official infectious diseases sources for reliable information – my go to source continues to be Dr. Fauci. Remember in this age of the internet, there are many unreliable sources of unsupported information. If you have concerns, please feel free to contact me for further discussion.

SUMMER Reading Plan

Life – and exercise – move at different paces for different people.

Some enjoy leisurely walks, strolls or rolls, while others speed-walk, jog or even sprint. Some people have a 26.2 sticker on their vehicle, indicating they've run a marathon, while others boast of running a half-marathon (13.1) or no marathon (0.0)!

Thankfully, you don't have to be an athlete of any kind to run the Christian "race." The Bible uses running metaphors, however, to encourage followers of Jesus to train, focus, persevere and attain the heavenly prize. Use this Summer Reading Plan to strengthen your faith and your relationship with Jesus. Complete one square each day or every other day, and you'll journey through significant chunks of the New Testament this summer. Feel free to invite a friend or family member to join you as a "running partner"!

Mile 1 Read Philippians 1
Re-read verse 6 and consider how your faith journey is a work in progress.

Mile 3 Read Philippians 3
Look back at verses 13 and 14, and brainstorm a list of ways to keep your eyes on the heavenly "prize."

Mile 5 Read Colossians 1
Re-read verse 11. Name three specific ways God gives you strength and endurance.

Mile 7 Read Colossians 3
Look back at verses 23 and 24. What keeps you running for God, not for other people or for personal accolades?

Mile 9 Read 1 Timothy 1
Doodle about how God's law keeps you from wandering away from him.

Mile 11 Read 1 Timothy 3
What aspects of staying "above reproach" are most challenging for you as a follower of Jesus?

Mile 13 Read 1 Timothy 5
Anonymously perform a kind deed for someone in your family or community.

Mile 15 Read 2 Timothy 1
Describe specific ways your life reveals a spirit of power, a spirit of love and a spirit of self-discipline.

Mile 17 Read 2 Timothy 3
Add a daily Bible-reading time to your spiritual training regimen.

Mile 19 Read James 1
Look back at verse 12. Reflect on how God has kept his promises to you. How does that help you during times of trial?

Mile 21 Read James 3
Re-read verses 17 and 18. Pray for godly wisdom as you continue your faith journey.

Mile 23 Read James 5
After re-reading verse 19, think of ways to reach out to people who have wandered away from God.

Mile 25 Read John 20:1-18
Consider how the good news of Jesus' resurrection gives you reasons to run and share the Gospel message.

➔ **Mile 2 Read Philippians 2**
Re-read verse 5 and pray to have the same attitude as Jesus.

Mile 4 Read Philippians 4
Write verse 13 on a sticky note and place it where you'll see it daily.

Mile 6 Read Colossians 2
Review verses 6 and 7, make a gratitude list and say a prayer of thanks to God.

Mile 8 Read Colossians 4
Write a note or letter to someone who needs spiritual encouragement.

Mile 10 Read 1 Timothy 2
Re-read verses 5 and 6. Offer praise to Jesus for being our mediator and ransom — and for running the race perfectly for us.

Mile 12 Read 1 Timothy 4
As you exercise, ponder verse 8 and brainstorm ways to build your spiritual muscles.

Mile 14 Read 1 Timothy 6
Review verses 11 and 12. In what ways might faith be viewed as a fight? To whom have you made bold profession of your faith?

Mile 16 Read 2 Timothy 2
Re-read verse 5. The next time you participate in or watch a sporting event, compare the value of God's "victor's crown" to earthly achievements.

Mile 18 Read 2 Timothy 4
Memorize verse 7. Think about people you know who have already "finished the race." How can their example strengthen you?

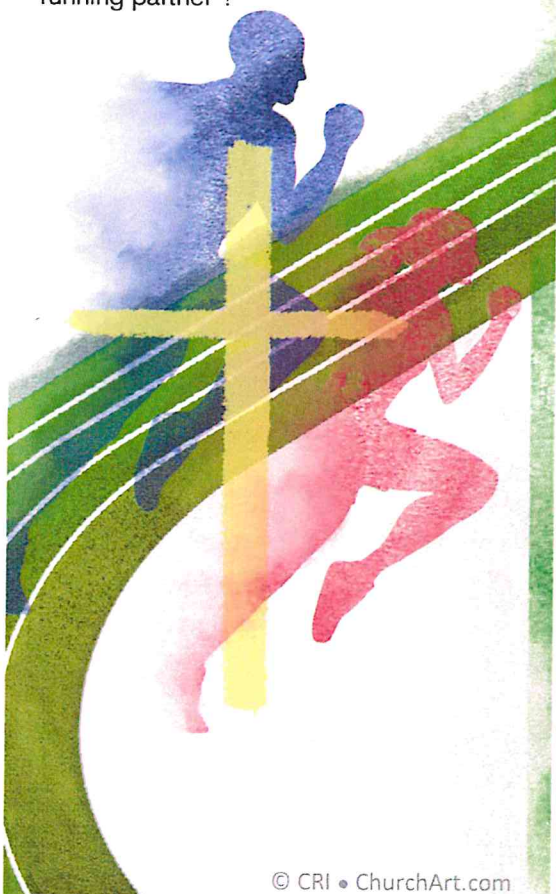
Mile 20 Read James 2

Review verse 8. Confess your sins to God and ask him to come near you.

Mile 26.2 Read Revelation 2:10 Praise God aloud: "Come, Lord Jesus!"





NOTE FOR PARENTS

Welcome to Summer Bible Reading Bingo! This is a resource for preschool and elementary children that will help them read their Bible during the summer and stay connected with God. This resource is designed to help children develop a daily quiet time with God that includes reading their Bible and getting to know God through His Word. It will help them learn how to use their Bible, learn more Bible stories, learn more about God, and will also help them with their reading skills.

What does this include?

This resource includes 4 Summer Bible Reading Bingo cards. Each age group (preschool and elementary) has 2 Summer Bible Reading Bingo cards. Each card is meant to last for a month. One month kids will read Old Testament Scriptures and the other month they will read New Testament Scriptures.

Preschool Bingo Cards

In each Bingo square for preschoolers, you will find a title of a Bible story. These titles match the ones found in the Beginner's Bible by Zonderkidz (if you don't own this Bible, you can use any preschool Bible. I have also included the Scripture it comes from in the space as well). Parents will read a Bible story to their child each day.

Elementary Bingo Cards

In each Bingo square for elementary kids (K-5th grade or 5-years - 11-years), you will find a Bible verse and a title that tells what the verses are about. Kids can open their Bibles, find the verses, and read them by themselves or with a parent.

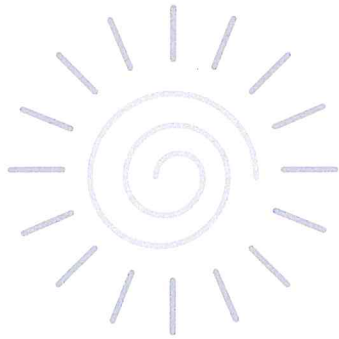

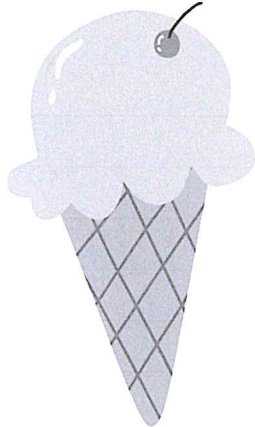

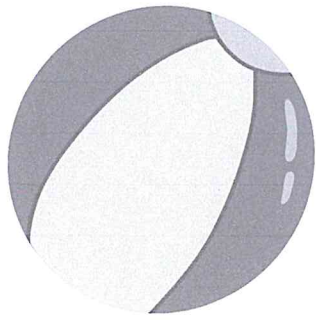
