

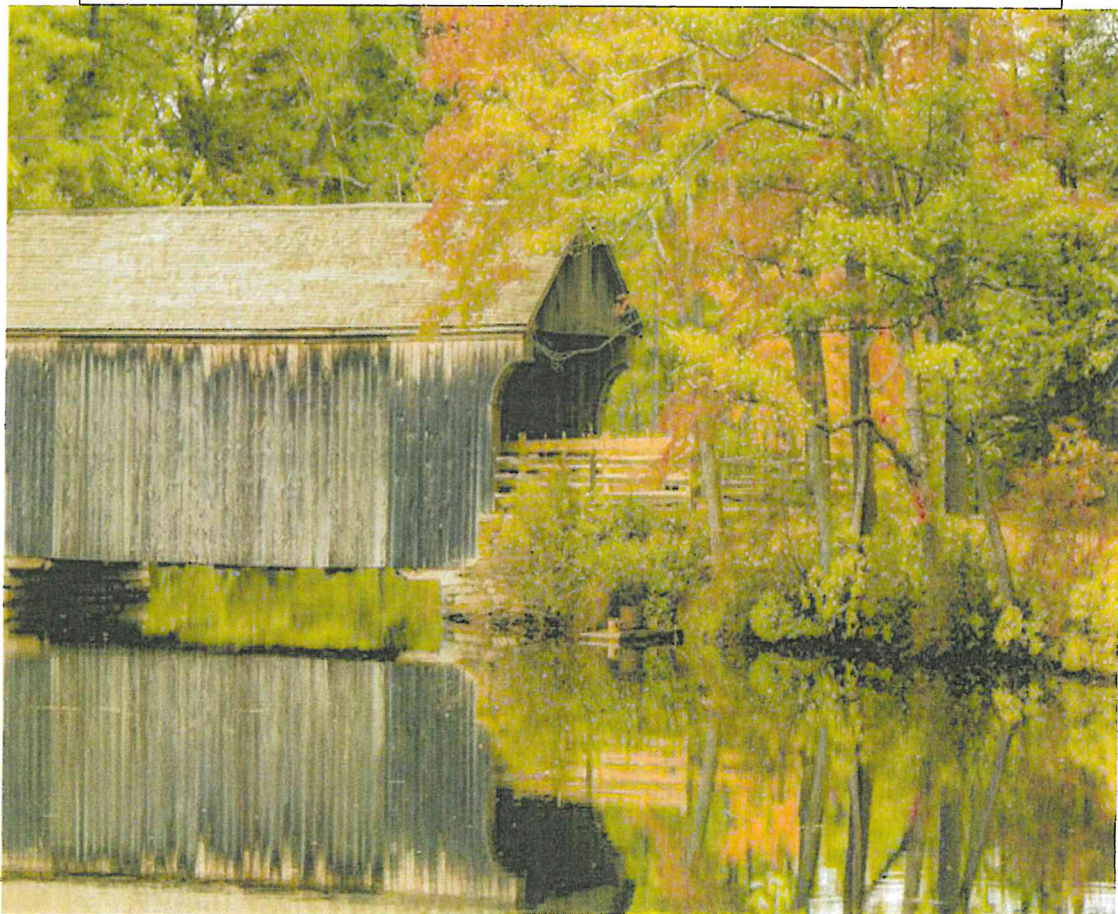

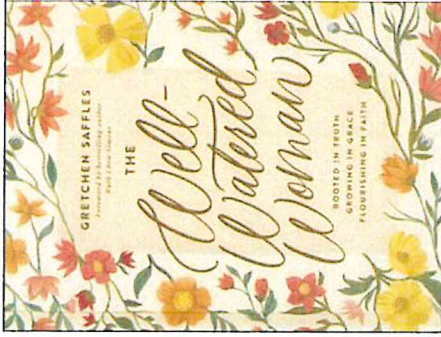
SUSANNA'S CUPBOARD – AND A REQUEST FOR HUMANPOWER!

It hard to realize that Susanna's cupboard has had its second birthday. Thanks to you all for your generous gifts of cash and food. Every container of food is welcomed. Every dollar is appreciated. Thank you, Thank You, THANK YOU!

News item and special thank you: Our faithful volunteer, Wanda Bagley, has served since the beginning days of Susanna's Cupboard: shopping, hauling food, planning, stocking, restocking, and filling the cupboard from three to five days a week. Every week. For two years. At the roughest estimate, that amounts to well over 425 trips to the cupboard in dedicated time and energy. Thank you, Wanda! 😊

So that leaves an opening, or maybe several openings, for people to step in and do this job. We fill the cupboard seven days a week, usually in the mornings. We are looking for a volunteer, or maybe several, to fill the cupboard on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays; rain or shine, sleet, snow, typhoons, or whatever. Our clients need food in all weathers. If you would like to take one of those days, please call Annette Sheldon at 440-479-8252 or Jeannie at JUMC, and she can get the message to Annette.

Our needs are shifting again. We need lunch box and snack foods for kids. Breakfast is still important. Single serving packages are perfect for kids to feed themselves on the weekends. Also, food for the homeless continues to be a need. Heavy protein: tuna, chicken, chili, hash, and canned meat of any kind. We purchase shelf-stable milk and put out two quarts every day. Bread, peanut butter, jelly, all are needed. **If you see a special advertised, maybe you will think of Susanna.**

HEALTH MINISTRY

Advance Care Planning

As promised in the August newsletter, our get together to discuss advance care planning will be October 6th at 4 PM. This will provide an opportunity to understand, review, and complete Advance Directives: (Living Will and Health Care Power of Attorney). These two documents do different things, and it is best to have both completed and shared with your doctors, hospitals, and close family.

The **Living Will** spells out what kinds of treatments you would want or not want and putting that in writing.

The **Health Care POA** appoints an individual (your “agent”) and an alternate if the primary person is unable to fulfill that role. Your agent could legally make medical decisions for you if you were unable to do so.

These legal documents go into effect only if you become incapacitated and are unable to speak for yourself. If such a situation ever occurs, you would have prepared your agent to make decisions according to your wishes. Changes can easily be made in the future if you wish to change your mind about anything, especially if your health status indicates the need to do so.

The following article provides excellent explanations for the many questions usually expressed.

CHRISTIAN CAFÉ

As the fall days approach, we start to think of comfort food and meals together. Christian Café occurs on the first and third Tuesdays each month. This is a wonderful ministry and provides nutrition as well as fun and fellowship for the givers and the receivers. We have talked for several months about when will Christian Café come back with eating in Wesley Hall.

Our shiny new steam table is here, ready and willing. To continue with meals in the old format we will need more human power: to prepare food, package food for 50 delivered meals, serve food to 70-80, bus tables, wash pots and pans, and run the dish machine, and generally clean up. It isn't as bad as the list looks! Trust me! But, it does take many hands, generally on 2-3-hour time slots. For example: 9-11 AM is food preparation; 1-2:30 is packaging food for the deliveries and requires 2 folks ride along to deliver the food to the door; and lastly 3-6 has been getting food ready and packaged for about 50 pick-ups at the back door, and of course the washing of bowls and pans.

It would be great if we could have enough volunteers that folks could alternate Tuesdays – time will tell. We will get the trusty clipboard out to pass again – that seems to be working really well. Stay tuned!

If you are interested in helping, you can let me know anytime -you don't have to wait for the clipboard!

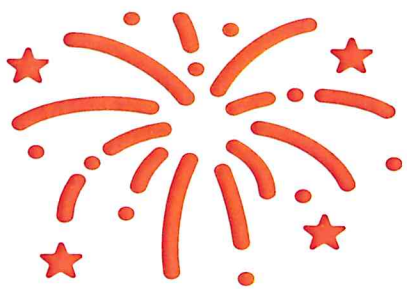
