Instead, let us find our perfection in Christ and the surety that Christ's love carries us through in those moments that overwhelm. This is my prayer for you; this is my prayer for me. This is my prayer for us.

Holy One, in the moments that seem too much; give strength. Bathe us with Your gentleness and humility. Help us to support and lift one another. Remind us to give each other grace and love, even when we perhaps may be usure of how to so do. Invoke and enliven your Spirit that we may be emboldened to live as your kin-dom, knowing that we do not all have to agree with one another, but rather, we are charged to all love one another. Thank you, O Lord for support and for a love that carries us, especially when we cannot carry ourselves or one another. Amen.

# **Book Recommendation**

As our Thursday morning Women's Bible Study looked more closely into the lives of Sarah and Hagar, our study reminded me of this excellent book that made its way to my Top 20 Spiritual Book list several years ago. It's written by Anne Graham Lotz (Billy Graham's daughter)


and titled "Wounded by God's People." It's available at Christian bookstores and of course, Amazon. Below you will find a description of the book.

Tucked into Abraham's biography is the story of Hagar, a young Egyptian slave with whom Abraham had a son named Ishmael. Hagar stood out because she was wounded--not physically, but in ways that were as emotionally and spiritually painful as any injury to a body would be. Some wounds were provoked by her own bad behavior, but others were inflicted by those who considered themselves God's people.

As Hagar's story unfolds, you will discover that wounded people often become wounders themselves. While Anne identifies with the wounded, the unpleasant reality is that she also identifies with the wounders, because she has been one, too. She knows from experience that wounding is a cycle that needs to be broken. And by God's grace, it can be.

Many have had similar experiences. And perhaps you are among those who have been so deeply hurt that you have confused God's imperfect people with God. Maybe you have even run away from God as a result. Or perhaps you have been a wounder to the extent that you are living in a self-imposed exile, believing you are unworthy to be restored to a warm, loving relationship with God or with God's people.



## **End of Life Care Planning**

Thinking about or talking about care planning for serious illness can be difficult and is something we'd rather not think or talk about. That proverbial "head in the sand" approach doesn't help us if we need to have such a conversation. Please think about this: **Do you have a Health Care Power of Attorney?** (This is not a financial power of attorney.) Or: **Do you have a Living Will?**

Advance Directives include Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care and Living Will - they are separate documents that do different things. These are available online, are free and an attorney is not required to complete these health care documents. I have the forms readily available and will be glad to meet with you and your family member at your request for a personal conversation. Making the decision to complete this process when you don't see an immediate need to have it in place will be a valuable gift to your loved ones. Have the conversation; talk about the "what ifs of life".

Please read again the following quote:
