As we make our way more fully into the fall season, I find myself looking forward to the many aspects and traditions that are becoming ever closer like beautifully colored leaves, Thanksgiving, and Advent. All these events are elements that surround our faith, and it is in these moments that we often find ourselves reflecting. Often during the fall, we also get geared up for learning

more about stewardship and how we can live as better representatives of God here on this earth. That is what I would like us to turn our minds and hearts to now. As Christians and children of God, we must understand that our lives are not our own, but they belong to our Creator. God has given all of us gifts, which we are to use wisely to serve both God and others. These gifts are understood to take shape in many forms. Our money and tithes are considered a gift, as well as having the gifts of patience, discernment, compassion, mercy, justice, and many, many others. It is through these gifts, that we are called to care and be responsible stewards of the endless resources that were entrusted to us by our God and Creator. An excerpt from an article on SeedTime offers a little more insight into this Biblical concept of stewardship. "Stewardship is something that I hear a lot of talk about, but not a lot of understanding. I truly believe that understanding what stewardship is and how it applies to our lives will change the way we make decisions each day. If we really understand what it means to be good stewards, we will begin to not only see our lives change, but also the world around us. Like all other Biblical principles, tremendous benefit is gained by following them. Let's look at the actual definition of stewardship.

Stewardship:

1: the office, duties, and obligations of a steward

2: the conducting, supervising, or managing of something; especially: the careful and

responsible management of something entrusted to one's care: stewardship of our natural resources

I like how it says, "managing of something." To me this implies that we have decisions to make and are responsible for that over which we are stewards. Just like a manager of business is responsible for his/her department and employees, so we are with all that has been entrusted to us."

This passage reminds us just what stewardship is and how expansive it is over our entire lives and beings. I encourage you all to reflect more on this important concept. For the next few weeks, we will be looking at how we can further our understanding of stewardship, so we may live and give with extravagant generosity. In Psalm 24 it says, "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." It is with this understanding that we can look forward to sharing what God has given with all those around us, so let us get excited about this new journey of looking at the many aspects of stewardship that we hold with other important times of the year.

May this prayer guide us as we further examine what it means to be good stewards of our gifts and resources. ""Oh Lord, giver of life and source of our freedom, we are reminded by the Psalmist that Yours is "the earth and its fullness; the world and those who dwell in it." We know that it is from your hand that we have received all we have, and are, and will be. Gracious and loving God, we understand that You call us to be the stewards of Your abundance, the caretakers of all You have entrusted to us. Help us always to use Your gifts wisely and teach us to share them generously. May our faithful stewardship bear witness to the love of Christ in our lives. We pray with grateful hearts, in Jesus' name. Amen."







# Care Planning



Talking about care planning for a serious illness can be difficult and is something we'd rather not think about. A Health Care Power of Attorney gives you the chance to specify what types of medical care you would want to have in a serious medical situation. Does your closest friend or relative know what your wishes would be? Do you know what his/her wishes would be? A health care POA spells it out and would give that loved one the ability to make medical decisions on your behalf based on what your wishes are. (This form is for health care purposes only and has nothing to do with financial issues.)

A living will does not name a person to have that ability to act on your behalf but details what you would wish your physician to do for you.

The forms are not lengthy or complex. They are free and I can provide them. You do not need an attorney for either one of these forms. If uncertain what you need/ want, please talk to me. Questions about medical terms? Ask me! I'll be available to meet with you at a convenient time and place.

"We can't plan for everything. But we can talk about what is most important – in our life, and in our health care – with those who matter most. Having this conversation is one of the most loving things you can do for those closest to you." For more information on how to talk about this subject, go to this website:

The Safety Committee has been encouraging attendance at a CPR class so you can learn lifesaving skills. Nine of our church folks have attended a class – everyone expressed this feeling: "I'm so glad I took the class – I learned a lot." The paramedic who taught the class stated the following statistic: the average response time to a home for a 911 call is **4 to 10 minutes.** What if your loved one experiences a cardiac arrest? In cardiac arrest the heart stops beating, and the brain will suffer irreversible damage after 3-5 minutes. How close is the rescue squad to your house? What if all the units are out on other calls? Would you be able to provide CPR? Please consider attending a 2-hour CPR class. More dates will be made available for the Jefferson squad. South county has a class the last Thursday of every month.

PS: Jesse is the paramedic severely injured when a car hit their ambulance. The other paramedic has also suffered some injuries. Please pray for their recovery.

#### Shine Project - Vocational Training Program



In Cambodia, we have more women than men but if only one person in the family can go to university, the parents will choose to send their son, not their daughter. In fact, many young girls are discouraged from continuing education after they finish elementary school to help out in the farm or work at a factory. Young women who have no education or skills frequently opt to get married at a very young age and hope their husband can offer them economic sustenance... only to be

mistreated or abandoned with a baby or two.

Shine Project started two years ago to offer a preemptive assistance to single women (ages 16-26) who are middle/high school dropouts. By offering vocational training where they can attain government sealed license (Khmer food, western food, baking, barista, makeup, hairstyling), they can attain and maintain better paying jobs. As they are attending schools, we offer three seminars (basic Christian education, money management, and women empowerment) to help them to continue in their success in life. We have been able to help 15 young women so far. Please pray for us so that we can continue to help many more young women of Cambodia. *Written by Youlika Vann*
