In the holiday movie, *Jingle All the Way*, Arnold Schwarzenegger and Sinbad play fathers Howard and Myron – fathers who always seem to disappoint their sons by putting their work before their families. Therefore, they both set out on a mission to buy the season's hot holiday toy – Turbo Man

– for their sons for Christmas day. The problem is, they both forgot about it until the day before Christmas. Thus, the movie finds them using any means necessary to battle the crowds on Christmas Eve and get the toy before it's too late. They fight off others who covet the same toy, run from store to store attempting to get it before the store sells out, and just do some plain nasty things to each other – only caring about themselves more than others. Why in one scene, Howard even goes as far as to think about stealing the gift from under his neighbor's tree – meant for his neighbor's son. And Myron uses a fake bomb threat to get his way at the local radio station. All this for a gift!

Every year it amazes me how crazy everyone gets around the holidays, and for the wrong reasons. I guess it shouldn't surprise me now, seeing as it happens every year, but yet I still find myself amazed at how we all get so frazzled, stressed, and hectic this time of year – myself included. Yes, even though we make that promise every year that this is going to be the year we don't get caught up in it all, it just never seems to happen. The holidays are just naturally a hectic, harried, and chaotic time of year – largely because we have such expectations and we go crazy trying to make sure those expectations are met. So much so, in fact, that sometimes we find it hard to believe that God can bless this chaotic and congested time – or that God can even be found. But the thing is, God can't be contained by society's rules and customs. Yes, God works outside human conventions to create bridges where we cannot even imagine them.

So, as we come once again into this season of expectations, I encourage you this year to expect the unexpected. Instead of getting bogged down on the traditional expectations and on the chaos which comes with the Christmas season, allow God to work through you and bring new possibilities to you. Be like Mary when she was visited by the angel Gabriel and accept the unexpected. Have faith and let God show you miracles beyond your imagination. Change your expectations and understand that God cannot be contained by a box. Thus, neither should we. In other words, instead of looking for the superficial, we should look for the magnificent and the extraordinary.

See, part of expectation involves promise. For Mary it was awaiting the promised birth of the Son of God. She had to wait nine months – a long time to wait for something so magnificent. But she believed enough to keep waiting. She had expectation.

What are some promises of God that excite you? What are some things you are waiting for from God? How can we *all* be more alert and expectant of God's unfathomable ways? This holiday season, I encourage you to not be bogged down by the normal expectations. Expect the extraordinary. Allow God to take shape in your lives. Instead of waiting for Christmas to happen, be awake and ready, and go make Christmas happen for others. And prepare for the greatest gift of all – the gift of Jesus Christ.

There will be a Mission Committee meeting on Mon., Dec. 30 at 6:30 to allocate our Change the World funds.



Health Ministry Focus

I am continuing my campaign to have additional folks take a CPR class. After the holiday season is but a distant memory, I will work towards having some group CPR classes to encourage your participation. Consider for a moment: you and a close friend/ relation/ significant other are at home and that person collapses. You determine that the person does not respond to you, and you can't get a pulse. Panic quickly

sets in. What do I do? You call 911. But how soon will help be there? 4 minutes? 6 minutes? 15 minutes? What if both units are out on other calls? Time is critical. We know that the first 4-6 minutes are crucial and will likely determine that person's ability to survive.

You have thought about taking a CPR class in the past, but you've never gotten around to doing anything about it. Besides, they are so close to where you live. It will be OK.

Keep in mind, the average response time of an EMT team is 4-10 minutes. That can be too long. My goal is to get a sign-up process going in the New Year to have some group classes. Stay tuned for more information. Look for that famous clipboard coming around. Make this a New Year's resolution; take the class. What if 2 hours spent in the class could save the life of your spouse, your child, your parent, your best friend? Think about it. If you have questions, please contact me.
