Early this month we will celebrate the 4th of July – commemorating the 248th birthday of our country and once again partaking in one of our nation's greatest pastimes. How do *you* celebrate the 4th of July? Picnics? Parades? Baseball Games? Swimming? Fireworks? Yes, for whatever reason, we seem to go all out on this day. Maybe it is because summer is finally

here and we love to enjoy all the fun that this season brings. Maybe it is because the birth of our nation is worth a big celebration. Maybe it is because we enjoy having fun with our families and friends. Whatever it is, the 4th of July is a big bash each summer.

Our family is no different. For as long as I can remember, the tradition in our family as I was growing up was to go to our lifelong family friends' house in Mentor. See, the big Mentor Headlands Parade goes right by the front of their house each year and thus they invite friends and family over to fill their lawn for the parade and then enjoy a huge picnic afterwards. (When I say huge, I am talking about a picnic every United Methodist should be proud of!!! Hot dogs and drinks were provided and then everyone was asked to bring a side dish AND a dessert!) Sometimes, however, I wonder if we lose the true purpose of this holiday amidst all the celebrating. Furthermore, the whole notion of celebrating freedom cannot be mentioned without remembering where our ultimate freedom comes from – our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave us all freedom from the bondage of sin. In 1 Corinthians 15:3-4, we read:

But even more importantly, rejoice in the freedom we have through our Savior. Jesus Christ came to save us all – and *that* is a freedom worth celebrating!










SUSANNA'S CUPBOARD






MANNA DRIVERS

MISSION WORK




Christian Café Update

Christian Café continues to hum along as our many dedicated workers prepare and serve delicious meals for our many faithful followers. We continue to expand our group of workers but can always use more. We have recently been blessed with many willing (and welcome) hands to complete the cleanup process at the end of serving. This has made it possible to be finished much earlier than usual, so a huge shoutout to our new helpers and all our veteran helpers. These meals would not be possible without all our volunteers. To help you gauge how many hands are needed to accomplish this, we recently served a little over 100 folks in Wesley Hall, had 35 take outs and delivered close to 50 meals.

Now comes the request. I do my best to coordinate our staffing so that Carole and Doreen have all the helpers needed to prepare the food and Wesley Hall, and the needed help to serve and cleanup. I would like to create a list of back up folks willing to be called to fill in when more help is needed - this is usually with advance notice. Our church programs depend on the generous contributions of our church family. As of the end of May 2024, we are significantly short of meeting our budget, and the Finance Committee is asking everyone to prayerfully consider increasing your support of our
