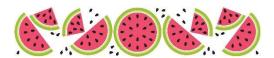


MANNA DRIVERS

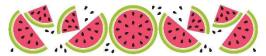

ONGOING PRAYER OPPORTUNITIES

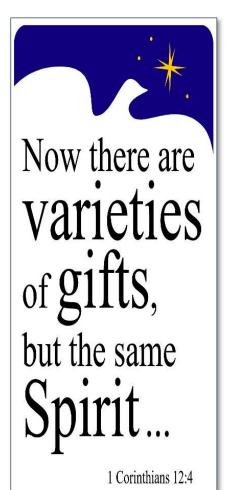

QPR Training

(Question, Persuade, Refer)

QPR is an evidence-based gatekeeper training to help prevent suicide.

Participants learn to recognize warning signs of suicide, offer hope to a person who might be experiencing a suicidal crisis, and how to get help and save a life.

Participants who complete the course should be able to:

- Recognize someone at risk for suicide
- Demonstrate increased knowledge of intervention skills
- Describe knowledge of referral resources and how to refer someone to help
- Understand common myths and misconceptions about suicide
- Understand suicide as a national and local public health problem
